The birth of new companies in the global innovation ecosystem is accompanied by the creation of new stakeholders that support entrepreneurs in the early years with the aim of turning their projects into profitable and scalable companies. Accelerators and Incubators are some of these; initiatives that are playing an important role to consolidate local ecosystems and help a certain number of companies to consolidate vital area for growth like an MVP (Minimum Viable Product) to launch to market, the business model, legal aspects and scalability of the revenue model, once tested, among other aspects.

But it is important to note that an accelerator and an incubator are not the same thing, as each enters the life of a start up at a completely different phase. What's more, these initiatives, which have seen significant growth in the city of Madrid have very different "godfathers" and founders. There are corporate accelerators, almost always verticalized within very specific sectors and with very defined objectives of the companies that sets them up; others, private incubators or

accelerators are usually led by successful entrepreneurs and investors who are looking to improve their deal-flow of investments or support very promising startups with a view to investing in them in the early and subsequent stages; or there are more public and institutional initiatives that are creating innovative environments and their aims are usually generating wealth or strengthen the entrepreneurial ecosystem for the area where they're located or for the city in question.

Madrid has a healthy presence of initiatives related to acceleration and incubation of innovative companies and has seen significant growth over recent years as a result of the interest of large companies in gaining entry to the world of digital transformation and innovation.

The Spanish has already past the 50 number accelerators and incubators. But before delving deeper into each of these, we're going to define what they are and what differentiates

INCUBATOR, ACCELERATOR AND VENTURE BUILDER

The terminology in the world of innovation grows day by day and the high number of stakeholders that form part of the ecosystems sees new actors emerge on the maps of the cities. Below we define the four types of initiatives that help companies grow and scale their projects: incubators, accelerators, venture builders and company builders.

Incubators: usually support entrepreneurs in the creation of companies in the embryonic phases. For Armando Ulisi, founder of the incubator Incúbame, the incubators "prepare teams and projects to receive economic and human capital and in the short term can opt to begin their second speed (real start up) in an accelerator, their foundations, through capitalisation, or their financial game muscle, through funding rounds or the participation of investment rounds."

The main functions of incubators are:

- To seek business ideas with growth potential.
- To help the entrepreneur build a company from the very start.
- To receive support from mentors who advise and guide the founders.
- To help recruit the key people to build the work team.
- To create the business idea and make it fit the market.
- To support the entrepreneurs in closing funding rounds.
- To be a shareholder of the company.





For Félix López, director of the accelerator SEK Lab, "incubators and accelerators are like a mechanical workshop where you go to review or prepare your car (start up) for a race". Adding that "they help you review the key points so that you leave with certain guarantees of success and you don't run out of gas halfway there (traction and financing) but above all everything will guide you in the right direction (the focus of your business, you value proposition.

Accelerators are stakeholders in the ecosystem that enter the more advanced phases in companies. They are usually specialized in specific sectors (fintech, insurance, travel, education, etc.) and they run open calls so that companies is somewhat more advanced phases can apply their programmes.

After a selection process, accelerators choose and announce the best companies, which participate in their acceleration programmes for a period. The investor Carlos Blanco confirms that the accelerator "only retains between 5% and 15% of the shares of the companies they accelerate and are a quality filter for investors. Which allows them to identify a qualitative deal flow". Various European reports confirm that startups that come through accelerators have more possibilities of getting ahead

The aspects that define accelerators are:

- They usually receive limited programmes over time.
- They receives assistance in areas where they need improvements.
- They receive mentoring on the part of experienced investor.
- They help them generate traction and scale the business.
- They are offered a physical space where they can develop the project.
- They train and help them to obtain external financing.

Another formula is to assist companies in the growth of the acceleration programmes. Javier Megías, founder of Startupxplore, states that they stand out "they're programmes designed to boost the growth of startups on the basis of a combination of mentoring, training and access to a network of and experts".

For Daniel Soriano, Director of the Entrepreneurship & Innovation Center at IE Business School, "an accelerator is very important for those startups that feel lost in the product-market fit and growth (initial) phases". Daniel adds that the function of these stakeholders is to "provide processes, ecosystems and indispensable resources so that the startups can develop.

A more developed company could benefit from some of these aspects provided that the rest of the profits don't interfere with the growth strategy but they won't take advantage as in the case of the aforementioned.

For Daniel, what the entrepreneur is going to receive from an accelerator "is financial support and consultation and advice from experts in different areas, professional service and discipline, reputation and access to a network of interesting actors belonging to the eosystem."

Venture builder / company builder

both are more recent terms and have no track record. The term company builder is not widely known or used and can be linked to the corporation, but is currently used as a synonym for venture builder. For Javier Megías the difference between venture builder and company builder lies "in that a venture builder does not take a majority position in the company while the company builder does.

The difference in these initiatives is in the fact that they are usually projects launched by experienced investors, who articulate this type of vehicle to create existing companies in other countries, which are successful but have yet to get off the ground in the venture builder's country. They are usually copy-cuts of other successful startups, usually in more developed countries.

The aspects that define them are:

- They don't accept external ideas or projects.
- They usually define the ideas to be developed in advance
- They seek, at different events, the founder team for launch.
- They can retain equity in the company, depending on each one
- They validate the business model until it works. autonomously.
- They invest time and resources in the early months of the life of the project.

But there are more opinions on these sorts of initiatives. For Adrián Hereia, cofounder of the Madrid-based venture builder Sonar, "the difference between his initiative and the rest is Corporate Company Building, which consists of applying the same process to the needs of a corporation leading much of the disruptive innovation, which we can understand better as much more optimal than internal innovation, corporate acceleration and M&A.

For Clara Valls, Director of Communications at Nuclio Venture Builder, "these initiatives are an evolution of incubators, the main difference between them is that venture builders use copy-cut models while incubators, in general, innovate."





INNOVATION SPACES,

Hubs for stitching the entrepreneurial fabric of Madrid



Innovation spaces encompassing different types of initiatives provide significant value to the development of Madrid's innovation ecosystem. From the well-known coworking spaces and company incubators that house small companies with innovative ideas, to whole buildings and spaces specialized for very specific sectors combining disruptive startups and large corporations, they are helping Madrid become Europe's next technological hub.

The innovation ecosystem of Madrid has grown form two main landmark sites within the Spanish capital. The first of these has its origins in the birth of coworking spaces in Spain, in the year 2007, with the birth of the first shared work spaces: Garage30 and Loft2work. The second came with the inauguration of Campus Madrid, property of Google, in 2015.


The space, led by Sofia Benjumea, shows a clear trend in terms of innovation spaces that were already being set up in other parts of Europe.

Since the opening of Campus Madrid, over 1,300 events have been hosted and education programmes of more than 300 hours of mentoring have been held. 2,354 jobs have been created and the resident startups have raised over 37 million euros.

Campus has a network of over 30,000 members of its Community with over 100 different nationalities and of whom 36% are women.

On the other hand, the emergence of coworking spaces in Spain around 2007 must be highlighted, with Garage30 and Loft2work first pioneering coworking spaces to open in Madrid. Soon after that, WorkingSpace opened, which has maintained its presence in the Madrid capital to this day while the former two have since closed. Other shared working spaces worthy of note in Madrid also include Utopic_US and Impact Hub which also remain opened and expanding in new locations. Manuel Zea, founder of the website Coworking Spain states that "there are currently more than 1,200 coworking spaces in Spain and 250 are located in Madrid".



Campus Madrid is Google's space for entrepreneurs, which opened its doors in June 2015. Its mission is to offer an environment where any entrepreneur from anywhere in the world can go to work and meet other professionals and attend, training, events and talks. The building is divided into several areas: the auditorium where entrepreneurship events are organised by the Campus Madrid or by others in the entrepreneurship community; two-storey café and the nerve centre of the Campus where entrepreneurs can enjoy a coffee while working and the two floors for residents. One of these floors also houses the accelerator SeedRocket and Tetuan Valley. The other houses the residents of Campus Residency, a part of the Google for Entrepreneurs programme which provides financial support and the best of Google's resources to dozens of coworking spaces and community programmes in over 125 countries.

Campus Madrid is an open space for entrepreneurs, investors and mentors. It is only necessary to register on the website to become a member of Campus. The space seeks to foster Spanish entrepreneurship as a way of meeting point, connecting entrepreneurs and investors, generating networking and fostering the opening up of the entrepreneur community to the world. Furthermore, Campus Madrid organises different events over the course of the year, such as: Campus Job Fair, We Code (with Ironhack), TarugoConf, Startup Weekend, SeedRocket's annual Campus and Women Tech Makers.

Company incubators, innovative working spaces for Madrid's entrepreneurs

Madrid City Council manages, through its Directorate General for Commerce and Enterprise, six public incubators which have the purpose of housing and incubating entrepreneurial initiatives with activity in the Spanish capital, offering them to the founders of different types of services.

These incubators are located in the neighbourhoods of Carabanchel, San Blas, Puente de Vallecas, Moratalaz, Villaverde and Vicálvaro. Every year, a call is made to access one of these spaces, aimed at the newly self-employed and new companies (foundations, NGOs and non-profit associations cannot occupy the facilities), which must submit an economic-financial feasibility plan to verify the viability of their business and seek to create employment. The cost per square metre of each office is 7.15 euros for the first twelve months of occupation and 9.53 euros from the thirteenth month on.

The incubators are municipally, publicly owned spaces that combine the use of private offices of companies with many other services of interest for entrepreneurs. Along with the rent of offices, basic furniture and complementary services, also reception, monitoring and security, cleaning and maintenance and water, electricity and heating bills are included. Additionally, startups can use common areas such as meeting rooms and multi-purpose halls and also receive technical consulting

services, business training and information on assistance and subsidies and publicity channels for their businesses.

COWORKING SPACES AND INCUBATORS

Within the above mentioned incubators are initiatives for preseed projects focussed on those implementing their own business projects which need personalised attention in initial areas when it comes to creating a company. These are the pre-incubators, shared spaces geared towards self-employed individuals with a business idea and looking for a working space and advisers specialized in creating companies and validating working plans.

For shared or coworking spaces, self-employed individuals and companies must be active less than two years from creation and have business plan and submit the articles association of the company and all certificates showing that they are up to day with tax and social security obligations (and the corresponding models). The maximum residency period for these spaces is one year.

COWORKING SPACES,

a flexible economic formula for working in Madrid



The origins of the term coworking are in San Francisco (USA) in the year 1999, even though it never materialised in terms of a physical space with its own identity for another six years. In 2005 Brad Neuberg created the first such space which he called "Hat Factory." Years later, the same individual founded another space called Citizen Space, which is considered the first coworking space.

But, ten years earlier, in 1995, the first coworking spaces were already appearing in Europe. The first of those, in Berlin, was called C-Base and the second in Gràcia (Barcelona) called Kubik. These spaces were mainly multi-disciplinary apartments and spaces created by various entrepreneurs who are dedicated to different disciplines such as architecture, marketing or communication and among them they began to generate synergies and collaboration.

According to the estimates, in 2018 there will be more than 12,000 coworking spaces. In Madrid the number has grown exponentially over recent years and there are already over 200 such spaces in the capital and surrounding region, with Impact HUB and Utopicus among the first to emerge in the Spanish capital.

DESCRIPTION OF THE TERM

Coworking takes on different meanings in different spaces such as shared work, cowork, work in an integrated office or cooperative works. This discipline of work has a series of differential connotations such as sharing the same physical space in return for a monthly sum, normally at a more accessible price than offices, directed at entrepreneurs who are beginning a project or freelancers and the foster synergies between companies and entrepreneurs. Coworking spaces are considered an evolution of cybercafés, central cafés that offers internet connections as add-on services in such spaces.

The birth of new startups in the Spanish capital and rising rent prices in central areas of the city means that small businesses and entrepreneurs cannot afford central, well-located offices in Madrid, leading to a clear demand for working places and offices with independent offices that could be accessed by these companies. Spaces that offer a series of integrated services such as office space, furniture, electricity, water, internet, cleaning and common area (meeting rooms, bathrooms, lunch room, kitchen, etc.) at more affordable prices. There are also other formulas of shared space such as Innovation Spaces, normally privately owned, business centres also privately owned and public and subsidised incubators and business centres.


